Thanksgiving Dinner: A Tradition of Gratitude

Thanksgiving dinner dates back to 1621 when the Pilgrims at Plymouth Colony celebrated a successful harvest with the Wampanoag people. The original feast lasted three days and featured venison, wild fowl, fish, and native crops like corn and squash. Over time, turkey became the centerpiece of the meal due to its availability and size. Other dishes like stuffing, cranberry sauce, and pumpkir pie were added, creating the traditional Thanksgiving

spread.
In 1863, President Lincoln declared Thanksgiving a national holiday. Since then, it has symbolized gratitude, unity, and family gatherings. Today, while regional dishes and family traditions vary, the spirit of Thanksgiving remains the same—celebrating abundance, gratitude, and togetherness.
